The Pensacola Children's Chorus will host a Musical Theater Academy July 2 – July 6, 2018. This one week intensive course is offered to high school students who have an interest in perusing a career in vocal music.

Registration is \$185 per student with limited spots available. Academy hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday – Friday (holiday on July 4) and will be located at the PCC offices (46 E. Chase Street, Pensacola, FL 32502).

Students will be led by Pensacola Children's Chorus's (PCC) Assistant Director of High School Choirs, Hanan Tarabay. No stranger to Pensacola's stages and an alumna of PCC, Hanan Tarabay is an accomplished mezzo-soprano who has performed with Palm Beach Opera, Pensacola Opera, the Chautauqua Institute, The Spoleto Festival dei due Mondi (Spoleto, Italy), and the Opera Orchestra of the Teatro Regio (Turin, Italy), as well as several credits at the Interlochen Arts Academy (Michigan) and the Curtis Institute of Music (Philadelphia).

"If you want to compete at a high level you must understand the discipline and technique required," says Tarabay. "This week will be a deep dive on what the standard is and how to get there."
