## Sacred Heart to Provide Free Health Screenings in Pensacola, Pace, Century

During January, Sacred Heart Health System will provide free heart-health screenings at locations in Pensacola, Pace and Century for adults who are poor, elderly or uninsured. Heart-health screenings will measure blood pressure, blood sugar and total cholesterol, and can detect anemia. The screenings are helpful in diagnosing conditions that put people at high risk for heart attack, stroke, diabetes and other health problems.

- Jan. 16 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. at First United Methodist Church of Pace, 4540 Chumuckla Hwy., Pace.
- Jan. 22 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. at St. John's Catholic Church, 303 S. Navy Blvd., Pensacola.
- Jan. 23 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. at the Cobb Center, 601 E. Mallory St., Pensacola.
- Jan. 29 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. at Westwood Homes, 4400 Westover St., Pensacola.
- Jan. 30 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. at Century Senior Center, 6025 Industrial Blvd., Century.
