In January 2018, the Trump administration proposed a new plan that would open up nearly all U.S. waters to offshore oil drilling, including Florida’s Gulf Coast. Pensacola is on the frontlines of this fight because our coastal ecosystem and economy are incompatible with the dirty and dangerous offshore exploration and drilling process. *We have only a few months* until this plan is finalized, so we are tirelessly working with organizations and individuals across the community to build the “Protect Our Coast” movement and *demand our Representatives take action!*

After the films a panel of Pensacola residents will discuss their own experiences recovering from the BP Deepwater Horizon Disaster and the county-wide offshore opposition that sprang from it. We'll also discuss how we can work together to send a strong message to state and federal officials that Floridians are strongly opposed to new offshore oil and gas drilling off our coast.
